MICHEL GAUVIN

Mr. Gauvin, who was born in Quebec City in 1919, was educated at St. Charles Garnier College, at Laval University and at Carleton College (B.A. and B.P.A.). During the war, he served in the United Kingdom and in Northwestern Europe with the Canadian Army. He was awarded the DSO in 1944.

Mr. Gauvin joined the Department of External Affairs in March 1947 and was assigned to the Office of the Prime Minister until 1950. He served abroad in Ankara and Lisbon and as Adviser on Canadian Delegations to the International Commission for Supervision and Control in Indochina. In January 1958 he became First Secretary at Caracas and in 1960 Counsellor at Buenos Aires. In February 1961, Mr. Gauvin was appointed acting Consul General in Leopoldville and Chargé d'affaires, a.i. in June 1962; in 1963-64 he attended the National Defence College, Kingston, Ontario.

In November 1965 Mr. Gauvin was appointed Canadian Ambassador to Ethiopia and the Malagasy Republic and since September 1969 has been Ambassador to Portugal.

Mr. Gauvin is married to Patricia McNeill and they have two children.
