The said Bill was accordingly read the third time.

Mr. Cochrane moved, seconded by Mr. Rogers, That the said Bill be now read the third time.

Mr. Guthrie moved in amendment thereto, seconded by Mr. Pardee, That the said Bill be not now read a third time, but that it be re-committed to the Committee of the Whole House with instructions that they have power to amend it in the manner following:—

(a) By inserting the following words as sub-section 2, of section 3: "The sums of money voted in any year to be expended under this Act shall be apportioned among the different Provinces of the Dominion according to the population of the said Provinces, as established by the last census for the time being."

(b) By striking out clause 6.
