

(3) Every return made under subsection (2) shall be reported as soon as practicable to a justice of the peace who may, upon satisfying himself that the subject, specimen or document was removed, taken, shipped, had in possession or otherwise dealt with contrary to the regulations, declare it to be forfeited to Her Majesty and upon such declaration it is forfeited accordingly.

Offences and Penalties

47. Every person who violates a provision of this Act or the regulations is guilty of an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding one thousand dollars or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding one year or to both the said punishments.

Transitional

48. The Commission may, until the first Council of the Territory is elected and appointed,

(a) subject to the approval of the Governor in Council, enter into agreements with the Government of Canada in and for the purpose of any Act of the Parliament of Canada that authorizes the Government of Canada to enter into agreements with the Government;

(b) subject to the approval of the Minister, by order authorize the expenditure of money for territorial purposes and any money required for territorial purposes specified in such order, on the condition of the Minister or a person authorized by him in writing, be paid out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund.

Commencement

49. This Act shall come into force on the day of April 1900.
