To that must be added the commitment for transportation, \$170,000.

Mr. HANSON (York-Sunbury): I am glad to have this information. I shall study it and return to the question a little later. I may ask the minister for a further break-down, but I am obliged for what he has given so far.

Mr. DIEFENBAKER: With further reference to the question which the Minister of Finance has just answered, I should like to know how many private companies in Canada have received advances during the past year, the names of the companies to whom the advances have been made, and the amounts.

Mr. HOWE: Does the hon. member wish to have the names on *Hansard*?

Mr. DIEFENBAKER: I should think so.

Mr. HOWE: It is rather a long list; it would take half an hour to read it.

Alberta Nitrogen Company, ammonia, Calgary. The estimated expenditure is \$10,110,000, and there is a second commitment with the same company for \$207,750.

Mr. BLACK (Cumberland): Are these figures capital advances as opposed to what last evening were referred to as advances for operating purposes?

Mr. HOWE: Yes. My hon. friend has received from the Minister of Finance actual payments; I am giving now a list of all commitments the government has both for its own account and for British account for capital expenditures.

Mr. DIEFENBAKER: Will the minister divide them as between dominion and United Kingdom accounts?

[Mr. Ralston.]

Mr. HOWE: Yes. The two expenditures I have given represent a joint account, one-third Canadian and two-thirds United Kingdom.

The next is Algoma Steel Corporation Limited. There is a commitment of \$527,333, United Kingdom.

Aluminum Goods Limited, Toronto, \$4,500, Canadian.

Anaconda American Brass, Limited, New Toronto, \$2,290,000, Canadian. There is a second commitment with the same company of \$150,000, also Canadian.

Atlas Steels, Limited, Welland, \$349,312. This is a joint account, 77 per cent Canadian and 23 per cent United Kingdom. There is another for Atlas Steels of \$4,273; another for \$171,667, and another for \$161,000.

Mr. MacNICOL: Is that the Atlas steel company?

Mr. HOWE: Yes. These latter are joint, 50 per cent United Kingdom and 50 per cent Canadian.

Goldie and McCulloch Company, Limited, Galt, \$246,957, United Kingdom.

W. H. Banfield and Son, Limited, Toronto, \$128,325, United Kingdom.

Barber Die Castings, Limited, Hamilton, \$2,124, United Kingdom.

Wallace Barnes Company, Limited, Hamilton, \$1,841, United Kingdom.

Bata Shoe Company, Frankford, Ontario, \$28,050, Canadian.

I could give the purposes for which these expenditures are made. Does the hon. member wish to have that information?
