APPROVAL OF STATE TREATY FOR RE-ESTAB-LISHMENT OF INDEPENDENT AUSTRIA

Right Hon. J. G. Diefenbaker (Prime Minister) moved:

That it is expedient that the houses of parliament do approve the state treaty for the re-establishment of an independent and democratic Austria signed at Vienna May 15, 1955, and that this house do approve the same.

He said: Mr. Speaker, I intend to restrict myself in speaking on this resolution. It will be remembered that on February 26 the late secretary of state for external affairs, the Hon. Sidney Smith, informed the house of the government's intention to request parliament to adopt this resolution. Hon, members will have had before them the state treaty for the re-establishment of an independent and democratic Austria which was signed at Vienna on May 15, 1955 which terminated the four power occupation of Austria and permitted its re-establishment as a sovereign state. The allied and associated powers recognized that Austria was re-established as a sovereign, independent and democratic state.

The treaty was negotiated by Austria, the United Kingdom, the United States, the Soviet
