unacceptable for any party, any Government, to conduct the affairs of the nation when on one hand it says one thing and on the other it does something else.

My question to my colleague from Regina West, does he agree with me that it is high time for those who sit opposite to us to stand in their places and to represent their constituents in a forthright and honest way and change the legislation that is now before us to the way it ought to have been, the way they have promised it? Is there not an obligation upon the Government of the day to live up to the promises it has made to the people of Canada, and they ought to deliver forthwith in this chamber tonight?

Mr. Benjamin: In a short response to my hon. friend, I agree with the question he just put, and I respond also by saying to him that the very thing that is occurring in Moncton today was started under a Liberal Government when they ordered Canadian National Railways to start showing a profit or else. There would be no more capital investment. It was Conservatives who screamed bloody murder about Moncton. Who is carrying out what the Liberals started? The Conservatives.
