The PROCEEDINGS of the British and other Protestant Inhabitants of the Province of Quebeck in North America, in order to obtain an House of Assembly in that Province.

In the month of October 1773, the British, and other Protestant inhabitants of the province of Quebeck, having waited above ten years for the accomplishment of the King's promise of granting them a House of Assembly, as soon as the situation and circumstances of the said province would admit thereof, contained in the royal proclamation of October 7, 1763; and finding the inconveniencies of being without a regular and constitutional legislature; and being of opinious,
