It may here be mentioned that as soon as a man is enrolled in either of these corps, he becomes exempt from Jury and Constable service, and after seven years of such enrollment, this exemption will continue for life. The horses when enrolled, are freed from seizure in execution, and from distress for rent and assessment for taxation.
