league of nations; the unimpeded power of congress to decide questions of peace or war under article ten; domestic decision of all domestic questions; preservation of the Monroe doctrine; refusal to assent to the Shantung settlement; equalization of voting power in the league; Congressional selection of American representatives in the league; limitation of the powers of such representatives; and those on international conferences; and notification of the right of the international law conference to challenge the eligibility of American representatives in international labor bodies.

THE MOST IMPORTANT DISCUSSED.

In their conference today the Democratic leaders did not have before them the actual wording of the reservations as agreed on by the majority, but as had been told that the four generally regarded as domestic reservationists had withdrawn, domestic reservationists were not present.
