Price Current Says Growing Crop is Progressing Satisfactorily—Foreign Markets Steady.

World Office. Thursday Evening, Nov. 16. Liverpool wheat futures closed today 1/4 to 1/2 higher than yesterday and corn 1/2 to 3/4 higher.

Trade on the St. Lawrence yesterday was brisker and undisturbed than either morning or afternoon. In fact fall wheat showed a fractional gain, selling up to 81c, while goose was firm at 70c.

126 CARS AT CITY MARKET RECORD FOR TIME OF YEAR

Slightly Better Feeling All Round—No Advance in Prices—Sheep, Lambs and Hogs Steady.

Thursday, Nov. 16, will rank as one of the "big" days on the city market for the season of 1910. From all sources the receipts were 126 cars, composed of 1800 cattle, 2008 hogs, 2000 sheep and 21 calves.

A careful survey of the situation on the city market yesterday gives little ground for optimistic views with respect to local live stock trade. In the export cattle there is no improvement noticeable either here or on the British market.

Brocher Cottage—For the better class of buyers there was a fairly good one-day active demand, which cleaned up all the offerings and the trade to the city market was generally regarded as fairly good.
