INSURERS IN CANADA LIFE

Propose to Break Down What They Call the One-Man Power in the Company.

THEY'RE AIMING AT HON. G.A. COX

A Policy Holders' Association for Each County is the Suggestion-General News.

Hamilton, Ont., Feb. 17.—(Special.)—The Canada Life policy holders of Hamilton have started out in earnest on the fight to secure proper representation on the Board of Directors and to break down what they allege to be one man power, as personified in Senator Cox.

A large and enthusiastic meeting of policy holders was held this evening in the Board of Trade rooms. Mr. Samuel Barker occupied the chair and explained the deputations purpose in waiting on the shareholders at the annual meeting.

The aim of the association would be, he said, to obtain proper representation on the board and to have re-enacted the clause which prevented a shareholder having more than 40 shares, in this way abolishing the one-man influence.

Mr. Bristol moved, in effect, that such an association be organized in Wentworth County. Mr. H. F. Gardner and others strongly approved of the proposal, and the motion was carried.

A meeting will be held next Tuesday evening to form the Wentworth County Association, and after that it is proposed to continue the organization in other parts of the county.
