London, May 8.—Testifying to-day before the committee of the House of Lords now considering the copyright law, Mr. Anthony Hope, the novelist, urged the adoption of a margin of a fortnight as between England and the United States for registration, in order to facilitate the simultaneous publication that is now common. Mr. Scratton, the barrister, opposed the provision making it necessary to stamp every copy of a book as copyright.

Three Leading Principles.

London, May 8.—The Berlin correspondent of The Standard says: The United States delegates to the Peace Conference at The Hague have instructions to advance three leading principles: The institution of courts of arbitration; the extension of the declaration of Paris of 1856 to the non-confiscation of all cargoes not contraband of war, and the extension of the Geneva convention to war by sea.


