



Elaborate Preparations Under Way to Accommodate Strike-breakers—But 150 More Join the Strike.

MONTREAL, Aug. 10.—(Special.)—Interest in the C.P.R. strike was intensified to-day when 150 more men left work at the Angus shops. The latest addition are cabinet makers, steam fitters, painters and tinsmiths, yet in spite of this the company's officials assert that they are suffering no inconvenience.

With regard to the statement that many of the strikers were going back to work, Bell Hardy declared that his advice from along the line were to the effect that the men were suffering a few cases of defection, but the body was holding solidly together.

At the offices of the C.P.R. the attitude of silence is being preserved. No official statement is issued.

175 PASSENGERS PER HOUR OVER SUBURBAN

Development of Traffic on Metropolitan Indicates Great Possibilities—A Hint to the Railroads.

The development of suburban traffic cannot begin until the service is provided. Another condition is that there must be population before a service may be undertaken with some prospect of fair financial returns.

The Metropolitan Railway, the an electric road, indicates how people work in the city will take to the open places when a service is provided. The Metropolitan established what is for all purposes a suburban service, and at once population began to move northward along its line.

TO-DAY APPROXIMATELY 175 PEOPLE PER HOUR RIDE IN AND OUT OF THE CITY BY THE METROPOLITAN RAILWAY'S SUBURBAN SERVICE.

The line started out with poor cars and inadequate power. The traffic has compelled the Metropolitan to provide large express cars for what may be called the thru traffic, and the small Glen Grove cars will soon have to be replaced with something better.
