IN THE YEAR 1819.

April 10th.—The Moon will be totally eclipsed at 8 h.
 forenoon; invisible at Montreal.
 April 24th.—The Sun will be eclipsed at 6 h. 52 m. fore-
 noon; invisible at Montreal. A small part of the p's pen-
 umbra falls within the north polar circle.
 September 19th.—The Sun will be eclipsed at 7 h. 50 m.
 noon; invisible at Montreal.
 October 3d.—The Moon will be totally eclipsed at 10 h.
 forenoon; invisible at Montreal.
 October 18th.—The Sun will be eclipsed at 10 h. 36 m.
 noon; invisible at Montreal. The p's penumbra just
 touches the earth within the south polar circle.
 B.—In the columns of the Moon's rising and setting,
 small letter *m* stands for forenoon, and the small *a* for
 noon.
