JUDGE PARKER SCORES HEARST


Ex-Presidential Candidate Replies to Attacks of "Yellow"

NEW YORK, Oct, 2-Judge Alton B. Parker tonight gave out a statement in 7444 12242 reply to an attack made upon him by Wm. R. Hearst during a campaign speech in Brooklyn last night. In his address Mr. Hearst said that Judge Parker had appeared in an election case on the side of election criminals in the courts he formerly graced, and there argued against, and secured a reversal of an opinion he had formerly rendered.

Judge Parker declares he has for two years submitted, without reply to the wanton assaults of William R. Hearst. He declares he should probably pay no attention to "the maliciously false speech were it not that the necessity and intended inference of his speech constituted an attack upon a great court.

"The opportunity is afforded to warn the people that a man having such conceptions of the judiciary as will permit him to make such an attack ough never to be permitted to name men for the bench as Hearst and the Murphy-Hearst delegate contemplate doing."
