Debates Last Evening and an Address by Bishop LeBlanc—The Valerictory Address of J. Emeric Dolan of This City.

Memramcook, June 15—Commencement exercises in connection with the fifty-ninth annual convocation of the University of St. Joseph's College began last evening at the college when an address was delivered by Rt. Rev. E. A. LeBlanc, of St. John. Two bilingual debates were features of the evening. Each speaker was given fifteen minutes to deliver his argument and for six minutes of this time he must speak French. A debate on the rival merits of journalist and orator between A. M. Robichaud and A. L. J. Richard was won by the former. One between W. S. Bridge and J. Emeric Dolan, both of St. John, in which the former, maintaining that trial by jury was not the best method of administering justice, was won by Mr. Bridge. Bishop LeBlanc congratulated the college warmly and commended the college on the progress which had been made.

Today's programme included the delivery of valetories, in French by Flavien J. Samson and in English by J. Emeric Dolan. Presentation of degrees, diplomas and special prizes, etc., took place this morning. The exercises closed with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

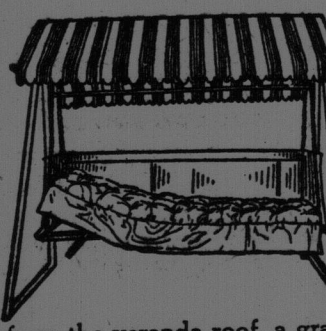

Snooze or Read In a Hammo-Couch



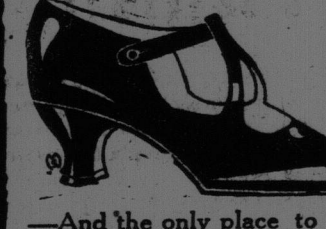
