Dublin, Feb. 2—A serious situation thas arisen over the boundary question to the federal department of agriculture in New Brunswick, has gone to Boston to visit the U. S. federal department labratory for combating the European corn borer to arrange that some of the parisites which have been successfully used in fighting the pest in the states may be imported from Europe for use in Canada during the next season.

The Canadian invasion has been centred in Ontario and has not reached into the maritime provinces, but Mr. Tothill was selected to represent Canadian headquarters in visiting the U. S. laboratory.




