

Father O'Brien is a native of Boston
and a few months ago came to the Canadian branch of the Redemptorist Congregation to assist on missions. He spoke
in St. Peter's church on Sunday, February 7 and his eloqence and subject matter made a marked impression. No word
was received at St. Peter's today regarding his condition. The damage to the
Palace is placed at \$60,000.
