**LEFT HERE BUT THREE WEEKS AGO**  
**Ill With Pneumonia, Rev. John O'Brien Rescued From Fire in St. John's, Nfld.**  
 The first intimation that Rev. John O'Brien, C. S. R., was seriously ill with pneumonia in St. John's, Nfld., reached the city last night in a despatch telling of a fire which destroyed The Palace, the residence of His Grace the Archbishop of St. John's. The despatch stated that exciting scenes attended the rescue of Father O'Brien, who was in the Palace seriously ill.  
 Father O'Brien left here three weeks ago in company with Rev. J. McLaughlin, C. S. R., Rev. Fred Cophlan, C. S. R., and Rev. S. Kearney, C. S. R., for Newfoundland to conduct a series of missions. While in the city the young Fathers were guests at St. Peter's rectory. Father O'Brien is a native of Boston and a few months ago came to the Canadian branch of the Redemptorist Congregation to assist on missions. He spoke in St. Peter's church on Sunday, February 7 and his eloquence and subject matter made a marked impression. No word was received at St. Peter's today regarding his condition. The damage to the Palace is placed at \$20,000.
