In presenting the financial statement for the year ending July 31st, 1899, I am happy to report that we have reduced the indebtedness \$2,369.81. The debt will be reduced more rapidly as the rate of interest is now reduced on all borrowed money to 4½ per cent. This reduction was effected as shown in the above statement. The amount received during the current year has been small, only \$200.41, arising from the custom to make all reports of collections through the District Meetings and Conferences. I would respectfully call the attention of the ministers to the smallness of the collections, arising from the fact of having no paid agent to present the claims to the various Conferences. It is sincerely hoped the ministers will not allow the Fund to suffer because of this lack.
