elections of 1896 when we had the privilege of enjoying the franchise the then representative of this
County gave us great and good promises what his party
would do for the Indians if they were in power. His
solicitations and glowing promises drew the majority
of the then electors to his support, but the promises
never materialized- worse- we find things just the
convenience
reverse. Trusting you will convey at your earliest
to the Indian Department, the contents and meaning of
my letter.
