MARGARET ANGLIN HAS LOST HER VOICE

Great Canadian Actress Obligated to Abandon Stage--To Undergo Operation--May Never Act Again.

New York, Nov. 8.—The World, in a special this morning from Chicago, says that Margaret Anglin, the distinguished Canadian actress, has lost her voice and is in a retreat at Glencoe, near Chicago, and may never act again.

The report goes on to say: Dr. George W. Whitfield, who is attending Miss Anglin, is quoted as saying: "Miss Anglin's condition is very grave indeed. Her vocal chords are in a frightful condition. In all my experience I have never seen a case where the nose and vocal organs have become in such a dreadful state. An operation will be necessary, but this cannot be performed at the immediate present, for she is in too nervous and unbalanced condition. I have ordered that not even her most intimate friends be allowed to see her. The operation may possibly be performed Thursday or Friday of this week."
