Newspaper Notes. GLEANED FROM VARIOUS BOURCH. Daylight Saving was defeated in the New Brunswick Legislature.

The price of potatoes in Summerside is 50 cents a bushel, and the demand is weak.

Advertising liquor will be a crime for British Columbia papers under the new B. C. Liquor Act.

Daylight Saving has been adopted again this year in Great Britain, France and most other countries.

No fewer than 450 of the members of the British House of Commons have served in France in the war.

The cost of the great war brought about the brutal Heus has been \$107,000,000—some \$11,000,000, 100 more than the property valuation of all North America.

A bill before the Provincial Legislature limits the load of motor vehicles to six tons and provides a close season in the spring for autos from March 30th to May 1st.

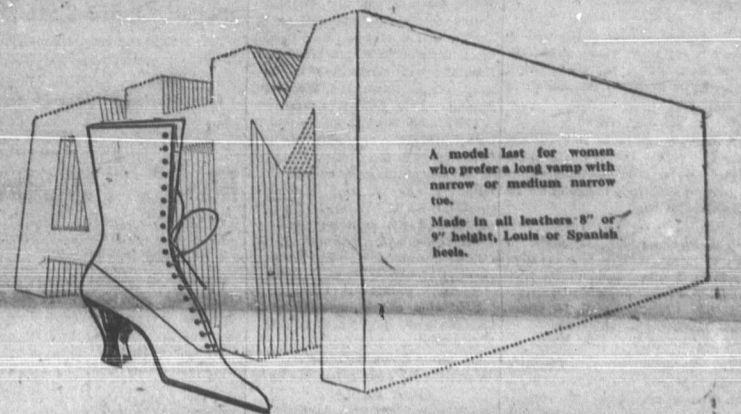
One of the greatest stores in New York City, doing a business of \$10,000,000 annually, estimates that two per cent of its sales, or \$200,000, is stolen from the store every year.
