The military style of the basque is accentuated by the trimming of soutache and wide Hercules black braid, which is very effective on the green whipcord of which the basque is here made. The basque extends a stylish depth below the waist and has coat laps and plaits at the back and a pretty flare below the closing, which is invisibly made at the center of the front. A decoration braid in accord with that on the fronts is on the one-seam sleeves, which stand out at the top in the fashionable puff. If preferred, tho sleeves may have shallow turn-up cuffs.
