

6 THE FORM OF THE LICENCE DIRECTED BY
THIS ACT.

By the Commissioners for managing and causing to be
levied and collected His Majesty's Customs, Subsidies,
and other Duties, in [where].

WHEREAS [Name of the Person]
one of His Majesty's Subjects residing at
[Place where] hath given Notice to us the Commissioners of His
Majesty's [Customs in Great Britain,
or, Revenue in Ireland] that he intends to lade at
[some Port of the United States in America] and import into
[some Part of Newfoundland] in the
[Ship's Name] being a British-built Ship navigated
according to Law, whereof [Master's Name]
is Master, bound to [where]; and it appearing
by the Register of the said Ship, the [Ship's Name]
whereof [Master's Name] is Master, that
the said Ship, the [Ship's Name] was built at
[Place where] and owned by

7 [Owner's Name] residing at [Place where] all
His Majesty's British Subjects, and that no Foreigner, directly or
indirectly, hath any Share, Part, or Interest therein:

Now be it known that the said [Person's Name]
hath Licence to lade on board the said Ship [Ship's
Name] at and from any Port or Place belonging to the United
States of America, Bread, Flour, and Live Stock, the Produce of
the said United States, and no other Article whatsoever, and to
carry the said Bread, Flour, and Live Stock, to some Port or
Place on the Island of Newfoundland, or the adjacent Islands to
His Majesty belonging; and on the Arrival of the said Ship at
any Port, Harbour, or Place of Discharge in Newfoundland, or
the adjacent Islands to His Majesty belonging, the Master or
Person having the Charge or Command of the said Ship is re-
quired
