

WHITE, PETER. (*North Renfrew.*)

Of Scottish descent. S. of the late Lient. Col. Peter White, who settled at Pembroke, 1828. B. at Pembroke, Ont., 30 Aug., 1838. Ed. there. M., Dec., 1877, Miss Thompson. A lumber merchant. Has been Reeve of the Tp. and Town of Pembroke. An unsuccessful candidate for present seat at g.e. 1872. Sat from g.e. 1874 until 14 Sept., same year, when unseated on petition. An unsuccessful candidate at the election which followed. Re-elected 22 Jan., 1876, on Mr. Murray being unseated. Re-elected at g.e. 1878-82, and again at last g.e. A Conservative.—*Pembroke; Ridcau Club.*

WHITE, ROBERT SMEATON. (*Cardwell.*) 2nd Mem.

Eldest s. of the late Hon. Thomas White. B. in Peterboro, Ont., 15 March, 1856. and ed. in Hamilton and London, Ont., and at McGill Univ. M., 1st. 1882, Ruth, dau. of the late James McDougall, of Montreal; 2ndly, 2 June, 1888, Annie, dau. of Capt. Barclay, Montreal. Was for a time in the employ of Gault Bros. Wholesale Dry Goods merchants, Montreal, and afterwards in that of the Bank of Montreal. Joined the Staff of the Montreal *Gazette* newspaper in 1884, and subsequently became chief editor of that journal. Has been Presdt. of the Junior Conservative Club of Montreal. First returned to Parlt. for present seat, 3 Oct., 1888, to fill vacancy treated by the death of his father. A Conservative: opposed to Commercial Union and Annexation. Believes Canada is competent to work out a prosperous national future as an auxiliary British power.—*Montreal.*

WILMOT, ROBERT DUNCAN, JR. (*Sunbury.*)

Second s. of Hon. R. D. Wilmot, ex-Lieut.-Governor of N.B. and ex-mem. of the Privy Council, (whom see). Great grandf. came to N.B. from New York, in 1783, after the American Revolution. B. in Liverpool, Eng., 1837. Ed. in St. John and in Sunbury Co. Grammar Sch. M., 1867, Elizabeth W., fourth dau. of B. E. Black, Halifax N.S. A farmer. Is a Lieut.-Col. in Reserve Militia. Has been a mem. of the Sunbury Municipal Co. and Warden of the Co. An unsuccessful candidate for the Ho. of Assembly at g.e. 1886. First returned to Parliament at last g.e. A Liberal Conservative, and a supporter of the National Policy. Favors any measure tending to bring
