

Bill to continue for a limited time and amend an Act passed in the fourth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for the more speedy remedy of divers abuses, prejudicial to Agricultural Improvements and Industry in this Province, and for other purposes.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is necessary to continue for a limited time and amend an Act passed in the fourth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for the more speedy remedy of divers abuses, prejudicial to Agricultural Improvement and Industry in this Province, and for other purposes ;" the duration of which said Act is limited to the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and twenty six : Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of *Lower-Canada*, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of *Great Britain*, intituled, *An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America,' and for making further provision for the Government of the said Province :'* And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that the said Act passed in the fourth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for the more speedy remedy of divers abuses prejudicial to Agricultural Improvement and Industry in this Province and for other purposes," shall continue to be and remain in force until the first day of May one thousand eight hundred and no longer.
