

tenant-Governor or person administering the Government of the Province, for the time being, in the penalty of to his Majesty, his heirs and successors, conditioned for the true and faithful performance of his duty in the execution of his said office, which recognizance shall be taken in, and remain among the Records of the office of the Secretary of the Province.

VI. Provided nevertheless, and be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that when any Register shall die or surrender his office, and that within the space of three years from and after such death or surrender, no misbehaviour appear to have been committed by such Register, in the execution of his said office, then and in such case at the end of the said three years after his death or surrender, the said recognizance so entered by him shall become void and of no effect to all intents and purposes whatsoever.

VII. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that every such Register shall be allowed for the entry of every such memorial, as is by this Act directed, the sum of and no more, in case the same do not exceed two hundred words; but if such memorial shall exceed two hundred words, then after the rate and proportion of six pence per hundred for all the words contained in such memorial over and above the first two hundred words, and the like fees for the like number of words contained in every certificate or copy given out of the said office, and no more, and for every search in the said office and no more.

VIII. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that if any such Register or his deputy shall neglect to perform his duty in the execution of the said office, according to the rules and directions in this Act mentioned, or shall commit or shall suffer to be committed any undue or fraudulent practice in the execution of the said office, and be thereof lawfully convicted, such Register shall forfeit his said office, and pay with costs of suit to every such person or persons as shall be injured thereby, to be recovered by action of debt, bill, plaint or information in His Majesty's Court of King's Bench for the District in which such offence shall have been committed.
