## AUAA Hockey All-Star Game "showcases marquee players"

## Halifax site of the "Battle of the Divisions"

The inaugural Tim Horton's Cup All-Star AUAA Hockey Game is being billed as an "All-star game showcasing the marquee players from the 10 Maritime University Hockey teams". The game will be played tonight at the Halifax Metro Center and will be shown live on TSN at 7:30pm. Prior to the game will be the Metro High School All-star game and the Timbit Novice Hockey Scrimmage during the intermission.

The game will see players from the MacAdam Division going against the Kelly Division. The local university hockey beat reporters-seven from NB and PEI chose the MacAdam Division and 11 from NS chose the Kelly Division-help to select the 11 starting players (a goalie, four defencemen, and six forwards). Each team consists of a minimum of three players from each university.

Starting for the MacAdam Division are UNB's defencemen Mike Cavanagh, forward Todd Sparks and goalie Frank LeBlanc, Vojtech Kucera of STU, UdeM's Raymond Delarosbil, Daryl Lavoie of UPEI on defence. The for vards will be John Nelson, K. J. White ard Jim Sonmez of UPEI, and Moncton's Dominic Rheaume and Jean Imbeau.

Selected by the coaches to round out the team will be UNB's forwards Toby Burkitt and Derek Cormier and Kelly Reed on defence, STU's goalie Johnny Lorenzo, defencemen Patrick Cloutier of STU, UdeM's Francois Chaput, and Richard Smit of Mt. A. Forwards suiting

up are Jeff Taylor of STU, Moncton's Patrick Caron, and Mt. A's Greg Foulidis and Brad Rusaw.

Tommies Eric Bissonette and Mike Bondy have been selected by the coaches as alternates. LeBlanc has been side lined with mono and will only be attending as a specator. Lorenzo has been given the nod to start with UdeM's Pierre Gagon as the back up.

The coaches for the MacAdam Division are UNB's Danny Grant assisted by Jack Dover of Mt. A, while in the Kelly Division the bench boss is Tom Coolen of Acadia assisted by Dal's Darrel Young. The coaches were selected on the basis of the team having the best record in their respective division and assisted by the coach with the most AUAA experience.

Starting for the Kelly Division is Acadia's Denis Sproxton in goal, forwards Dale McTavish and Dan LeBlanc of St. FX, Chris Skoryna of Acadia, Dal's Stephen Maltby, and Steve Kluczkowski of SMU. Acadia captured three of the

four positions patrolling the blue line Jeff MacLeod, Kevin Knopp, and Sean O'Reilly and Dal's Kevin Meisner.

Added to the lineup are goalie Darryl Paruette from UCCB, St. FX's Doug Synishin, Brian King of Dal, UCCB's Kris MacLellan, and Alex Herbison from SMU on defence. The forwards are Corey MacIntyre and Kiefer House of Dal, SMU's Rod MacCormick and Paul McCallion, Steve Martell of St. FX and UCCB's Gary Hickey.

The alternates will be Acadia's Jason Weaver and Dany Bousquet of Dal.

A notable omission on the Kelly Division is Dal goalie Greg Dreveny, the AUHC goals against average leader with 2.85, instead Paquette, who has the leagues worst record at 7.47 mark, has been added. Although Paquette has been brilliant most nights for the struggling Capers.

Two honorary coaches, Bob Mabie and Bob Boucher, have been named for each team.

Mabie is the Honorary Coach of the MacAdam Division. Mabie has been involved with the AUHC from 1966-73 when he coached the STU Tommies. During Mabie's time the conference was a one division league comprised of nine team.

Mabie's coaching highlight came in 1967 when the Tommies won the right to represent NB at the first ever Canada Winter Games. In 1969, he took his team all the way to the championship series against SMU.

Coaching for the Kelly Division is Bob Boucher who established himself over the past 27 years as one of hockey's winningest coach. His illustrious coaching career has included stops in the NHL with the Philadelphia Flyers, the OHL Windsor Spitfires, the AHL Nova Scotia Oilers, Nova Scotia Senior Hockey League nd presently the Maritime Jr. "A" Hockey League.

Boucher coached the St. Mary's Huskies from 1967 until 1980 and established himself as one of the game's most successful coaches. He coached the team to 10 first place finishes and second in his

other three seasons. The Huskies won nine AUAA championships, and appeared in the CIAU final six times. Boucher's overall record was an amazing 237-33-4. He was named 1973 and 1979 Canadian University Hockey Coach of the Year and the 1991 Sport Nova Scotia Coach of the Year.

The players will join their teammates to continue the regularly scheduled games.




