**Family
reunion**

All roads led to Brampton fairgrounds for members of the Brownridge family Saturday.

They came — 195 of them to be precise — from widely divergent points in Canada and the U.S. for the 13th annual reunion commemorating the 149th anniversary of the family in Canada.

President of this year's reunion committee was Earl Brownridge, PC representative in last Tuesday's election and former president of American Motors.

Incoming family president is Joe Brownridge, of Brampton.

A special memorial service held Sunday at Ashgrove United near Hornby, was taken by Rev. Robert W. Irwin of Chicago. Mr. Irwin, a family descendant, was formerly pastor of Richmond Hill United Church.

Thomas Brownridge, founder of the family in Canada, emigrated from Yorkshire in 1819 and homesteaded in Esquesing Township in the County of Halton. He married Eliza Ward of Islington, and they raised a family of seven sons and one daughter.

The homestead has been occupied successively by Thomas, Joseph, John F., Ellery, Thomas J. and Ward Brownridge, the present owner. It has been in the family for all but two of the 139 years since it was established.

Descendants of the original homesteaders now number into 700, about 500 of them still living, mainly in central Ontario. There are several families in B.C., Manitoba, and eastern and southern U.S.

The first family reunion, held in 1907 at the homestead, was attended by 84 members. Two hundred and twenty attended in 1958 and even more were at the last one in 1958.

The family reunions are usually held on or about July 1, "in commemoration of Canada's birthday, the founding of the family in Canada, and the honor and remembrance of pioneer forebears.

After the sun-drenched reunion Saturday, Mrs. Earl Brownridge commented: "I think we can say it was one of the better picnics".
