 has sustained by the early frosts
 are likely to embarrass the
 Indian Tribes settled on Lake
 Simcoe and near Pontam-
 -gushene, in the way of
 Provisions. I am satisfied they
 will require assistance before
 the termination of next winter.
 And the supply at Pontam-
 -gushene should be retained
 to meet such a contingency,
 not only on account of the
 price of the article, but the
 convenience of the Post-Office.
