Mr. King has asked me to acknowledge your letter of the 7th instant, in which you have given a complete statement of the advances made to Mr. King, on account of travelling, since April 24th, the total amount being \$435.84. This total agrees with our records.

You have already gone to so much trouble in the matter of the B. & O. tickets from New York to Baltimore, that it seems unfair to take advantage of your willingness to arrange for the refunds. Knowing the difficulty there would be, however, in arranging it from this end, Mr. King is only too ready to act on the suggestion of your letter and return the tickets to you. -- You will find them herewith. Please accept Mr. King's thanks for your kindness in this matter.

In order that our books will tally with yours, I have credited Mr. King's account, as you suggest, with \$13.56, the amount of the refund expected on the B. & O. tickets.
