Sir,

I have to acknowledge the receipt of a requisition for supplies for the New Germany school, and in reply I beg to say that the necessary stationery will be ordered from the Government Stationery Office. Some of the books asked for are not considered necessary at the present time.

You may also purchase two brooms, two common chairs, two combs, two cups, one looking glass, one pail, four cakes of soap, six yards of towelling and two wash basins. The tables, kettles, plates, etc., are not to be purchased till the Department is informed what use is to be made of them. They are not considered as part of the usual equipment of a day school, and the Department would like to be advised as to what use the Teacher intended to make of them. You will be good enough to obtain this information from the Teacher.
