With reference to your telephone message of the 13th inst. regarding the insane Indian, Angus Sears of St. Regis Band, I beg to inform you that the Medical Superintendent of the Insane Amylum at Orillia, Ont. stated to the Department that "if this young Indians is incame, he should be "committed to Brockville Asylum, as we do not admit people who are dangerous to themselves or dangerous to others, our Institution being solely for the care of the Feeble-minded. "However, you had better have the enclosed form of history filled up and returned to me, when I shall be in a better position "to judge of this man's fitness for this Institution." The form referred to was sent to Mr. Geo. Long, Indian Agent St. Regis on the 30th June to be filled in and has not yet been returned. As soon as it is received by the Department it will be transmitted to the Superintendent of the Arillia Asylum and at the same time Dr. Bruce Smith of Toronto will be communicated with.
