Madam:

In reply to your letter of the 12th. instant, I find that there was a ruling of the Department in 1891 with reference to the shipments of clothing to Indians in British Columbia. I find also that that ruling was occasionally departed from, but not to any great extent as it was the wish of the Department not to increase the expenditure by the heavy charges which would result from shipments to remote points. There was, I may assure you, no disposition to discriminate against your society.
