



Ottawa, 19th March, 1915.

Sir:-

I enclose for your information copy of a letter of the 12th instant, which the Department has received from William H. Curley, relative to insurance on his buildings. If, as appears, there is a double insurance on Curley's buildings, it would seem that the best course to pursue is to have him surrender the policy which he had placed. He should obtain a rebate from the company of insurance paid. If this course is followed, the risk placed by you on the said buildings should be allowed to stand, and the rebate which Curley obtains should be used by him in paying off his indebtedness of \$30.00 to the Department on account of insurance paid in July 1914. If Curley pays this indebtedness in full, the policy held by the Department will be made over to him.
