If it is intended to let the committee consider the possibility of awarding honours which would normally be accompanied by titles, but which were conferred without accolade, so that the recipient could not use the title "Sir" but could wear the insignia or use the letters after his name, the clause might read:
  - (b) of modifying or altering the said recommendations in so far as they relate to awards of honours and decorations which do not involve titles or titular distinctions; or to awards involving titles conferred in such manner that the recipients could not use the titles normally incidental to the awards.
