

received a severe strain in the left ankle in 1908. The ankle was operated upon and drained externally. Took his discharge 1912 and then served the U.S.A. Army for 2 years. Enlisted with the 241st Can Bn in 1917 going overseas with the Forestry Corps and arrived in France with them in July 1917. Left France Feb 1919. Arrived back in Canada March 1919 and discharged Category "A". First joined R.P.C.L.I. in 1919, serving for 2 years and then taking his discharge. He was again joined them in August, 1921, and remained with them until March of this year, when he was to be discharged for misconduct, under K.E. & O (Can) 1926 para 386 sub para 12. About the time that his discharge was to be carried out he went sick with his left leg, on routine examination at the Station Hospital, where he was admitted on 19-3-30 with pain and swelling of the left leg. It was found that he was also suffering from Glycosuria. He was kept under treatment in the Station Hospital until 11-4-30, when he was transferred to the Royal Jubilee Hospital for a Surgeon's report on his left leg. He was transferred back to the Station Hospital, Esquimalt, B.C. on the 28-4-30, ~~12/24/30/12/24/30~~ where he is still under treatment. On 12-4-30 Blood sugar was 200 m.g; but under dietetic treatment has now been reduced to 97 m.g.
