SALABERRY DE VALLEYFIELD.

Valleyfield is situated at the head of the Coteau rapids and foot of Lake St. Francis, on the south side of the St. Lawrence, in the County of Beauharnois. It was incorporated as a town in 1874. This town possesses an extensive water power, the fall of water being 15 feet, coming from an expansion of the St. Lawrence 35 by 5 miles. On account of this unlimited power, and owing to the absence of floods caused from back-water, large mills and manufacturing establishments have been located here. Valleyfield, being about 40 miles from Montreal, is becoming a centre of considerable importance. There are located here the Montreal Cotton Co.'s extensive factory, employing 1000 hands and turning out 80 different varieties of cotton, many of them handsome dress goods; A. Buntin's paper mills, turning out 16 tons daily; a woollen factory, employing 200 hands; two flouring mills, fitted up with the latest improved machinery; three saw mills and sash and door factories, two canning factories, soda water factories, and several smaller industries. The public buildings are fine and substantial-Roman Catholic, Presbyterian, and Methodist churches, the former costing \$100,000; good educational institutions, a convent, a college, an academy, an hospital, fire and police stations, market buildings, and two banks. This town has ten hotels and about 60 stores, also telegraph and telephone offices, Circuit Court, two daily mails to and from Montreal. A newspaper called "Le Progres de Valleyfield" is also published here. Valleyfield has a system of water-works unsurpassed in the province, and is lighted by the electric light—the Edison system. With the purest of water, many beautiful islands, good fishing and safe boating, summer visitors are becoming more frequent each season, especially from Ottawa. The Canada Atlantic Railway passes through the town. The Beauharnois Junction Railway will be completed in June, 1888. The Canadian Pacific has applied for a charter for a line passing Valleyfield. This will be the terminus of the St. Lawrence and Adirondack railway, connecting the St. Lawrence with the ore mines of the Adirondacks, a distance of 35 miles. Population of Valleyfield about 6000. Valuation, two million dollars.
