

HEREIN IS EVIDENCE OF THE EFFECTIVENESS OF UP-TO-DATE ORCHARD MANAGEMENT
The past season in Ontario has not been favorable to the production of high quality fruit. The damp weather was conducive to the growth of fungus diseases. Days on which the sun shone have been so rare that growers feared that exhibition fruit would not color properly. But in spite of these drawbacks the exhibits at the Ontario Horticultural Exhibition held in Toronto last week, a part of which may be seen in the illustration herewith, were as good as in any former year. Diseased or undercolored fruits were not in evidence. Surely this is strong testimony to the value of progressive methods of orchard management such as were practiced by the exhibitors at this fair!
