The same sort of pledge was given in every other Canadian community, with the result that there was established in Ottawa, the headquarters of a National Fund for the purpose named. Each month the local branches secure from the Treasury, the amount needed in their respective districts and sums collected in said districts go to the central treasurer. The disbursement sheets are most carefully checked at the Head Office and are finally submitted to the close scrutiny of the Auditor-General for Canada. The cost of administration is kept down to a remarkably low point, and a large part of the services rendered are entirely without pay. In fact, bank interest just about pays all


