

COUNCIL ADJOURNS

Will Convene Again on Thursday, July 9.

Bill Passed Placing \$25,000 In Hands of Commission to Exploit Quartz.

Saturday afternoon the Yukon council at about 5 o'clock adjourned until July 9 after sitting continuously for two weeks, the first session to be held since the election of the five members last winter.

The resolution providing for the appropriation was brought up by Newlands and on motion at Pringle the council at once went into committee of the whole for the purpose of considering it.
