GROUND IS APPLIED FOR

Dan Stewart Becomes a Concessionaire

Several Leases Are Desired on the Kashaw River Along the Dalton Trail.

The illustrious Daniel G. Stewart, he who always has the glad hand and the happy think for everybody, bids fair to become a bloated concessionaire very soon if the news waited in from Ottawa is confirmed by the subsequent appearance of Daniel himself. He and quite a few mysterious individuals who are known under the pseudonym of et al have made application for a number of contiguous concessions along the Kashaw river and its tributaries, which is located somewhere, though such knowledge is very vague here, in the Porcupine district within reasonable proximity to the Dalton trail.

Mr. Stewart has been in Ottawa all winter and it is self-evident that he has made considerable hay while the sun was shining, though it was in midwinter. Outside of those who have an acquaintance with the Porcupine district not much is known of the section of the river upon which the concessions are located.

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A gentleman well posted in all that country is Dr. Runsell, 55 present in Skagway, who is also interested in the deal. Several years ago he spent some time in exploring and prospecting that region and he is said to be enthusiastic on the Kashaw concession if the dirt is handled on a large scale either by steam shovel or hydraulic. A small item of something like \$3000 is required for surveys, etc., and then the concessionaire can acquire their leases, providing there are none of the old grants still alive. Mr. Stewart is expected inside in the course of a week or two.
