SCABIES IN CATTLE.

This trouble is a contagious dis ease caused by a parasitic mite. The kind which causes the most trouble lives on the surface of the skin and gives rise to great irritation and itching by biting. It most frequentand shoulders, at the base of the horns and the root of the tail. bureau of animal industry fully de scribes this pest in a recent bulletin, and suggests that the most effective method of getting rid of it is dip-ping. Everybody is familiar with the dipping of sheep to prevent scab. The same kind of treatment will answer for cattle. A suitable dipping device must be constructed. This on large cattle

and every man with a large number of cattle should have a dippin plant. After the plant is secured, the process is comparatively simple Some of the lime and sulphur dips are very effective and are not expensive. The following is suggested: Sulphur, 21 pounds, unslaked lime 16.75 pounds, water 100 gallons. Place the unslaked lime in a mortar box and add enough water to slake it and form a lime paste. Sift into this the flower of sulphur and stir Place in a kettle or boiler well with 25 to 30 gallons of boiling water and boil for at least two hours. This must be continued until the sulphur disappears or almost disappears from the surface. The longer the solution boils the more the sulphur is dissolved and the less caustic the ooze becomes. Pour the mixture and sediment into a large tub. Place near the dipping vat and provide with a bunghole about 4 inches from the bottom. Allow to settle for three or four hours.

tank provided with a bunghole is an absolute necessity, unless the boiler can be so arranged for both boiling and settling. An ordinary barrel with a spigot 3 or 4 inches from the bottom will be satisfactory. By means of this spigot the liquid can be drained off without disturbing the sediment. The dipping liquid in the tanks should be kept at a temperature of 102 to 110 degrees. Each animal should be kept in two minutes and be put completely under twice during that time. Very bad cases should be hand-rubbed and kept in the dip four minutes. Animals of all ages and in all conditions have been dipped without bad results.

Children Cry for CASTORIA THE FIRST AUTOMOBILE.

an Ancient, Self Movins Shrine of Bacchus. Few, perhaps, are aware that the first automobile, considered in the sense of a vehicle containing within itself powers of locomotion, of which there is any authentic account was a self moving shrine of Bacchus.

This was the invention of Heron of Alexandria, who describes it in his work on automatic mechanism. The shrine in question was mounted upo: two supporting and two driving wheels. On the axle of the driving wheels was a drum, about which was wound a rope, which passed upward through the space on one side of the shrine over pulleys and was fastened to the ring of ponderous lead weight, which rested upon a quantity of dry, fine sand. The escape of this sand through a small hole in the middle of the floor of the compartment containing it allowed the lead weight gradually to descend and by pulling upon the cord caused the shrine to move slowly forward in a straight line.

Heron describes the method of ar ranging and proportioning the wneels in case it was desired that the shrine move in a circular path. He also shows how the shrine can be constructed to move in a straight line at right augles to each other.

Officials of the patent office overlooked the device of Heron when they granted patents on slot machines, notwithstanding that previously Thomas Eubank, commissioner of patents in 1850, illustrated and described Heron's invention. The mechanism of the latter is almost identical with that in the modern device and simply serves as another proof of the saying, "There is nothing new under the sun."

STAGE LIFE TEN YEARS. New Crop of Minor Actors Harvested

Every Decade. A new crop of stage people is harvested in the United States every ten years. Each decade marks the beginning of a new epoch in theatrical his-

This fact does not apply so aptly to stars and stage people who dominate in the profession, for the life of these, so far as the public is concerned, is usually somewhat longer. But with the rank and file-those who never rise higher than the level of minor rolesten years is about the limit of endurance. After having served before the public for that length of time without doing anything sufficiently meritorious or novel to attract unusual attention the actor or actress, as a rule, passes away in so far as the profession is concerned, and a new crop is harvested among the many anxious recruits on the waiting list to fill the depleted

Men who dea! in the talents of stage people to the extent of reaping financial return from their labors are better qualified to "size up" the situation than others, and their experience teaches that few ordinary people o the theatrical profession remain longer than ten years in the business. They either achieve distinction-although this is the exception rather than the rule-or else drop into other lines after having been convinced by experience that the stage, so far as they are directly concerned, offers practically no opportunity for advancement. For this enson the rank and file of the profession is constantly changing, and the pular idea "once an actor always an ictor" is easily disproved
