Vienne's Strange Relie That Defied the World's Locksmiths.

In 1810 a blacksmith went to Viennay and locked an iron band around a tree with a padlock. What he did with the key no one knows to this day. There is a mirthful legend to the effect that he carelessly threw it into the air and that it never came down again. At any rate, the key could not be found, and the Austrian government offered a prise of 500 ducats to any one who could make a key that would turn the bolt in the lock without breaking it.

Many have tried to win the prise, but nobody has won it. Eventually it became the practice among the contestants to drive a nail in the tree and the heads of some of the nails bear the initials of those who drove them. The practice of diving nails into the tree sealed its fate.
