any desirable tint may be chosen for the small suits, though many of the best dressed children one sees are attired in neutral colorings—white linen colors, brown, dark blue and similar quiet tones that serve to throw their own rosy cheeks, bright eyes and shining hair into greater prominence. However, the gayer tints are also in demand in the garments and vivid touches of contrasting color in tie, belt, shoes and hat ribbon are smartly and becomingly employed.

Materials may be anything in the washable class from pique to fine linen, but always in boy's attire—selected with the idea of a certain substantial look of quality rather than with any suggestion of daintiness.

Most of the decorative effect of the small boy's attire, like that of his elders, lies in the cut and finish of the garments. Rows of stitching at the edges, stitched bands and small details of strapping and the placing of buttons furnish the most satisfactory adornment of the little suits. Tucks when used are wide, to give the effect of pleats. Narrow tucks, smocking, shirring and all similar devices belong only on the clothes of the sister, little or big.

Shoes and stockings are, as every one realizes, of the utmost importance so far as the boy's appearance goes, but are more vitally concerned than many people realize in the child's physical development and proper growth.

Shoes built on orthopedic models are the only kind tolerated by intelligent people, and any abnormal wear is carefully corrected as showing that some part of the physical adjustment is out of gear and needs attention. **First of King's Prize.**

**BEAUTY'S QUEST.**

To Be Found in the Right Kind of Breathing. Breath is life. Breathing is the most important function of the body. A proper supply of air and a properly controlled breath mean health, vitality, magnetism and beauty. Breath control is the greatest means of spiritual development, according to the Hindoo, and people of the west are awakening to the fact that physical and mental health depends largely on correct habits of breathing. If every woman in this country knew how to use her lungs fully, nerve sanitariums would have to shut up, and the rest cures would be things of the past.

There are a great many different ways of inhaling the life giving oxygen, and after deep breathing has been mastered and becomes a habit the subject can try some of the other breaths, taken from various oriental sources. Those suggested by Yogi Ramacharaka in his science of breath are strongly to be recommended, and excellent results have been obtained by practicing them. Anything that will impress woman with the vital necessity of making real use of the life force which is all about us and which we inhale with every breath is to be acclaimed with joy. It means not only health to this generation, but freedom from disease for the next.

On getting up in the morning, while still clad in your nightdress, stand firmly with the back against the wall, touching the wall with the back of the head. Inhale through the nostrils with a sensation that the air is going to the bottom of the lungs first, and slowly filling up the space until you can take in no more. The chest lifts up of itself and you should retain this position with the air in the lungs while mentally counting three. Now expel slowly the breath through the nose, keeping the chest high and pressing the breath out of the bottom of the lungs first. The chest sinks down last. Repeat this

breathing exercise ten times. Do not try to hold the breath too long or count too slowly. If you feel a choking sensation while retaining the breath, begin to exhale at once, but always exhale slowly.

The awakening breath exercise will stimulate the nervous system and create force and energy for the person who practices it. Stand erect, filling the lungs according to the first exercise for deep breathing. Hold the arms out straight in front of you with just enough energy in them to keep them in position—they should be as limp as possible. Now draw the hands back toward the shoulders, putting as much force as possible into them, so that when they reach the shoulders the fists will be tightly clenched and a tremulous motion is felt. Then, still retaining the breath, push the fists out slowly and draw them back rapidly without losing the tension in the muscles. Repeat this several times, then exhale quickly through the mouth.

**An Invalid's Alphabet.**  
We all know the misery of being kept in bed for a long or short period and how heavily time hangs. We exhaust books, papers—in fact, everything—and become a burden to ourselves.

A girl with original ideas is responsible for the "invalid's alphabet." This consists of a series of letters, one of which only is to be opened each day. The "alphabet" is started by cutting all kinds of interesting pictures and matter from various magazines. Let us suppose the invalid is fond of art. If so let A stand for art. Get some nice smooth paper and fold a sheet over it as if to fit an envelope. Write on the outside, "A for art," and gum inside some artistic reproduction (if by a well known artist write a few items in the "Who's Who?" style).

The envelope is made of bright hued crepe paper, cut and folded to shape, but tied with baby ribbon and not sealed, and on the address side is pasted a large cut out capital letter. There are lots of interesting subjects for the remaining letters of the alphabet, B for "babies" or "birds," F for "fun," any amount of jokes and pictures, M for "music" or even "motors" and the helpful R for "religion." **Socialist Interparliamentary Congress Expels Newspapersmen.**

London, July 18.—The general congress of socialist Interparliamentary committees opened here yesterday under the presidency of James Kier Hardie, the socialist member of Parliament, and chairman of the Independent Labor party.

The first action of the congress was to expel the newspapersmen present, the foreign delegates fearing that detailed reports of the proceedings would bring them unpleasantly to the notice of their Governments.

The attendance was not large. The European continent was represented by about twenty-five delegates, including a member of the Russian Parliament. Several women delegates were in attendance.

The Christian Brothers' case is a stated case, arising from the claim of the Christian Brothers to the right to teach in Ontario schools without qualification.
