Local and Provincial.

Quite a number of Wolfvillians are in Halifax this week attending the Carnival.

Mr Wellington Neary, formerly of Union Street, Gasperau, died on Wednesday morning, aged 80 years.

A large number of tourists have this week visited the Hotel American in order to get a glimpse of Mr Deane's "old French coffin."

Haymakers are now busy. The weather has not been very favorable but notwithstanding a large quantity of very excellent hay has been got up.

The ladies of the Brooklyn Baptist church are to hold a "Cherry Festival" in the hall at Avonport this evening, when a good time will no doubt be had.

Mr Henry Roscoe, of Long Island, had the misfortune on Monday of last week to cut off two fingers of his right hand with the scythe of his mowing machine.

Mr Harry Palmer, of the same place, lost the third finger of his right hand on Friday, in the same manner.

We have been requested to announce that the Executive of the Grand Division of the Sons of Temperance have been compelled to make a sudden change in the locality and date of holding their Quarterly Session.

Owing to taking off of boat between Weymouth and Westport, Digby Co., it has been decided to hold session at Wolfville, on Tuesday, August 11th, at 3 p. m.

Mr D. F. Reame, of Montreal, who has secured the sole right for the sale of the Kitchman Woven Wire Fence Machine for the provinces of Quebec, Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island, was in town for several days last week, endeavoring to dispose of the right for Kings County. The machine was on exhibition on the American House lawn where a number of feet of fence was made, to show how the machine worked.
