Our Book Review.

"THE FIRST FIVE HUNDRED."

In our issue of Saturday last we referred to a History of the Royal Newfoundland Regiment, which has been written by Mr. Richard Cramm of this city, and which has just been put on the market. To-day we are able to give a more lengthy review.

The book is divided into two parts. Part I is a history of the Regiment sub-divided into five chapters, which are headed as follows: Chapter I, "From St. John's through Gallipoli"; Chapter II, "1916 in France"; Chapter III, "From Guendecourt through Monchy-le-Preux"; Chapter IV, "Three Important Engagements in the latter Part of 1917"; Chapter V, "The Closing Year of the War." Each chapter gives a full description of the engagements in which our Regiment took part coming within the period reviewed by the chapter, and is well illustrated both from a historic and an artistic standpoint. Each chapter contains also one or two maps which show clearly the various sections in which the Newfoundland Regiment fought. The history is written in a style that makes it absorbingly interesting from start to finish, while sticking closely to the facts, and gives numerous accounts of individual heroism and achievements.

Part II is confined entirely to the "First Five Hundred" or "Blue Puttees," and is planned in a unique and attractive manner. At the beginning of this part are photographic cuts of the officers who left Newfoundland with the first contingent. A group of four is artistically arranged on each page, and on the opposite page the military records are given. The others are arranged so that three photographs where the photographs were obtainable, and three military records are given on each page. This presents a splendid appearance, and cannot fail to meet with a big welcome from families who had some one with the first contingent.

The volume is strongly and appropriately bound, and presents a neat and attractive appearance. The printing is on highly glazed, art paper so that the photographs come out in splendid shape. Mr. Cramm's book is a splendid contribution to Newfoundland literature, and is the most valuable book that could be placed in the hands of a Newfoundland boy or girl.

'The Blindness of Virtue'

A Real Sensation; Casino Theatre To-Night.

One of the strongest sermons against the fallacy that ignorance is the strength of virtue is "The Blindness of Virtue," a new play from the pen of Cosmo Hamilton, an English writer. In an entertaining way Mr. Hamilton makes a plea for the education of the young people in the mysteries of sex. He shows that result from the failure of the mother to speak to her daughter because of a prudish sense of delicacy that most people mistake for modesty, and Hamilton attacks it fearlessly yet without grossness.

Lured by Women.

The Pas de Calais Assize Court had before it a case of murder, the victim being an Englishman named Richard Fielding, captain of a London barque. It was stated that on arriving at Calais with his ship, Fielding met two women, a widow named Pett, who kept a small public-house in Calais, and her servant. He accompanied them to the Casino and returned to the public-house, where the two women, it is alleged, attempted to rob him. Fielding resisted, whereupon the widow struck him on the back of the head with some sort of instrument with much force that he fell unconscious. The two women then threw him out of the window into the street, where the body was subsequently found. The servant, after arrest, confessed to the crime, but the widow strenuously denied having any share in it. The Public Prosecutor demanded the death penalty for the widow, and said he would accept a plea of mitigating circumstances for the servant.

World's Deepest Gold Mine.

Australia is said to possess the deepest gold mine in the world. It is situated at Bendigo, Victoria, and is known as the New Chum Railway Mine. The miners who work in it are obliged to travel down a shaft nearly three-quarters of a mile deep. The heat in the mine is terrific; the temperature of 108 degrees being so weakening that it is necessary to spray the bodies of the miners continually with cold water from above ground.
