Dr. James Moffatt's Bible

The Old Testament, translated direct from the Hebrew into modern and liberally phrased English, robbed of its "begats," its "bullrushes" and its "Noah's Ark," as well as its "mess of pottage," has made its appearance, published by the George H. Doran Co. The translation is done by the Rev. Dr. James Moffatt, of Glasgow.

The "begat" in this version is replaced by the idiom, "was the father of." Noah's ark is a "barge," and it is made of cypress instead of gopher wood. Esau sells his birthright, not for a mess of pottage, but for a "red smelette," and the Garden of Eden becomes a "park." In general, the translation is parallel with that of the New Testament, done two years ago by the same Biblical scholar.

The book differs greatly in ver biage and in some instances in meaning from the King James version. A storm of comment, not all of it approving, is anticipated from the clergy throughout the world. Dr. Moffatt, who has honorary degrees from Oxford, has held the chair of Church history in the United Free Church College, at Glasgow, since 1915, Formerly he was Yates professor of Greek and New Testament exegesis in Mansfield College, Oxford.

The work carries none of the archaic rhetorical forms and none of the obsolete words that are found throughout the King James transaation. The quotation of instances gives no complete picture of the work asmuch as islated examples lack the characteristic tone of the whole One striking change is that from 'God's covenant" with Noah into a 'compact" in the Moffatt version. Again, in Genesis vi, 10, where the King James version says, "And Noah begat three sons," Dr. Moffatt's translation reads, "Noah was the father of

In Exodus, where the mother of Moses hides her infant from the Egyptians, Dr. Moffatt avoids the use of the word "bullrushes." The King James Bible recites the story as fol-

"And when she could not longer hide him, she took for him an ark of bullrushes, and daubed it with slime and with pitch, and put the child "And when she could not longer therein; and she laid it in the flags by the river's brink.

"And his sister stood afar off, to wit what would be done to him. "And the daughter of Pharoah came down to wash herself at the river; and her maidens walked along by the river's side; and when she saw the

ark among the flags, she sent her maid to fetch it." Dr. Moffatt translates it:

"When she could hide him no longr, she took a creel made of papyrus reeds, daubed it over with bitumen and pitch, and put the child in it, laying it among the reeds at the side of the Nile. His sister placed herself at a distance, to see what would happen to him. Now the daughter of Pharoah came down to bathe at the river; her maidens were walking along the bank, and as she saw the creed among the reeds, she sent her slave-girl to fetch it."

In some instances, where quotations have become a part of the idiom of the language. Prof. Moffatt has not disturbed the verbiage of the King James scholars. An example of this is found in the story of how Jacob won from his father the blessing inwon from his father the breader pos-tended for Esau—a victory made pos-sible by disguising his hands as he for which he had asked. In the Moffatt as in the King James Version, Isaac's words are: "The voice is Jacob's voice, but the hands are the hands of Esau."

The garden of Eden appears, in the Dr. Moffatt translation, as a parfl. According to the King James script: And the Lord God planted a garden eastward in Eden."

The later book reads: "In the land f Eden, to the far east, God the eternal then planted a park."

Moffatt avoids the word "Babel"

and writes: "Down came the Eternal to see the city and the tower which human beings had built. 'They are one people, said the Eternal, 'and they have one language; if this is what they do, to start with, nothing that they ever undertake will prove too hard for them. 
