From one of Mr. Fleming's party, who came through with him from Fort Garry, we learn that they experienced most delightful weather throughout the entire trip. At Fort Victoria not the Saskatchewan, on the night of the 25th of August, a severe frost was experienced, but the weather was clear and beautiful. Mr. Grant preached at Fort Victoria morning and evening on the 25th. The party always laid over on Sunday. At this point a great many Indians of the Cretibe visited the camp. They were very friendly. A most laughable incident occurred here. Mr. Fleming's party were provided with umbrellas. The chiefs asked the loan of the parachutes, and the request being granted, they proceeded deliberately to strip off all their clothing, and then concluded their "talk" with the King George men in a nude state. Several other tribes were subsequently met and interviewed. Between Forte Carlon and Victoria two chiefs were entertained at dinner. Mr. Fleming explained to the Indians the object of his visit, and they seemed pleased at the prospect of a railroad coming through their territory.


